The Committee on Finances met on March 10, 2001, in Research Triangle Park, North Carolina, reviewed the performance of Sigma Xi's investments, and recommended a draft budget for FY 2002 to the Executive Committee. The purpose of the Research and Operations Fund is to provide annual support for research and Society operations. The purpose of the Building Fund is to finance construction of the new Sigma Xi Center building.

The Research and Operating Fund yields reflect the decision of the Board of Directors to favor long-term growth potential over current yields. Due to continued market instability over the past year, the market value of all-Sigma Xi funds decreased by 15.97 percent from July 1, 2000 to June 30, 2001. However, the Committee is confident that, over time, investment performance will return to historical averages.
