The purpose of the Building Fund is to finance construction of the new Sigma Xi Center building.

The Research and Operating Fund yields reflect the decision of the Board of Directors to favor long-term growth potential over current yields. As the result of continued market softness over the past year, the market value of Sigma Xi Research and Operations Fund decreased by 10 percent from July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2003. However, the Committee is confident that the adjusted investment strategy will produce improved investment performance as the market returns to historical averages.
