Biography

Dr. Daniel Druckman is Professor Emeritus of Public and International Affairs at George Mason University, an Eminent Scholar at Macquarie University in Sydney and an Honorary Professor at the University of Queensland in Brisbane. He has been a research fellow or visiting professor at the Australian National University (Canberra), the University of Melbourne, the University of Western Australia (Perth), the Yunlin University of Technology in Taiwan, and the University of Uppsala in Sweden. He has published widely on such topics as international negotiation, nationalism, peacekeeping, justice, the interplay between values and interests, and research methods. Two of his books, *Doing Research: Methods of Inquiry for Conflict Analysis* (Sage, 2005) and, with Paul F. Diehl, *Evaluating Peace Operations* (Lynne Reinner, 2010) received the outstanding book award from the International Association for Conflict Management (IACM). He also received lifetime achievement and Rubin Theory to Practice awards from the IACM in 2003 and 2018 respectively and from the Novancia Business School in Paris in 2016.
